We are extremely proud that a high number of our year 13's have gone on to secure apprenticeships or full-time employment with 50% joining degree apprenticeship programmes.





Pre-apprenticeship Programme

Working alongside of our industry partners and the University of Hull, we are proud to have launched our Pre-apprenticeship Programme in September 2018. This structured programme is designed to deliver our students into industry with well-rounded skills including CV and application writing, personal branding, increased industry knowledge, self-confidence, work ready skills and self-awareness.

Developed and supported by industry partners it includes site visits, real project opportunities and industry mentors to put our students ahead of other schools and colleges with a strong, personalised portfolio. Alongside of this the progamme will be accredited with an A-level qualification! An exciting opportunity for young people around the region to gain a unique learning experience with industry experts such as Phillips 66, Cristal, Jacobs, British Steel, ECITB and many more!

- Gyrocopter Theory and building paper sycamore seeds to test span length efficiencies
- Paper rocket launching and exploring the fin position and size
- Building a Balsa paper aeroplane to explore the wing span and centre of gravity in aerodynamics.
